What's the difference between buying a consignment vehicle and a regular vehicle purchase?

When you buy a consignment vehicle at Sunday Drive, we're acting as an agent for the seller, and do not own the vehicle. Think of us as a broker—we help both the seller and the buyer, making sure everyone gets a fair deal. We work to ensure you get great value and quality.

What we do for you (the purchaser)

- Finance: We can help structure deals with Sunday Finance. Both the new vehicle and trade in vehicle can be subject to encumbrances to finance companies that we will facilitate transfers and refinancing packages.
- Trades ins: With our nationwide network of vehicle re-sellers we can trade your vehicle as part payment. If you're trading in a vehicle, it must be received by Sunday Drive before we release the new vehicle to you. This is especially important if the vehicles are being shipped across the country.
- Inspections: We highly recommend a pre-purchase inspection to identify any existing issues or ensure modified/classic cars have the proper certification. We offer specialized inspection options depending on the type of vehicle and assist with this process to ensure high quality and iron out any pre-existing issues that may need to be rectified prior to delivery.
- Delivery: We prepare the vehicle for delivery and add additional accessories and extras. We handle fund transfers in a safe and secure way for both parties and complete the change of ownership
- Warrant of Fitness: All vehicles will come with a new warrant of fitness no older than 28 days from issue at delivery, (unless otherwise agreed)
- Shipping: We assist with local, national, and international shipping. While we coordinate the process as a courtesy, any shipping delays or damage once the vehicle leaves our care are the purchaser's responsibility.

You'll also need to insure the vehicle under your own policy.

Other Terms:

Warranties: Many consignment vehicles are classic, high-performance, exotic, or race cars. Some of these vehicles may have exceeded their original lifespan or could require more maintenance than a regular vehicle. Because of this, consignment vehicles don't come with an after-sale warranty from Sunday Drive, unless:

- There's still a manufacturer's warranty in place
- You purchase an aftermarket warranty from Auto Sure
